
## <u>§29 CFR 1904.10 – OSHA Guidelines for</u> <u>Recording Threshold Shifts</u>

Use this decision tree to determine whether the results of an audiometric examination given on or after January 1, 2003 reveals a recordable STS/PTS



Note: The current audiometric results may be compared with the original baseline audiogram taken when the employee was first placed in a hearing conservation program - or the revised baseline audiogram as prescribed in 29 CFR 1910.95. These determinations are not affected by whether or not the employee previously experienced recordable hearing loss.

Note: If a retest is performed at any time following the determinaton of a recordable STS, and the STS is not confirmed as persistent, the case is no longer recordable and may be lined our or erased. When retesting does not confirm persistence, the STS may be redefined as a Temporary Threshold Shift (TTS).
